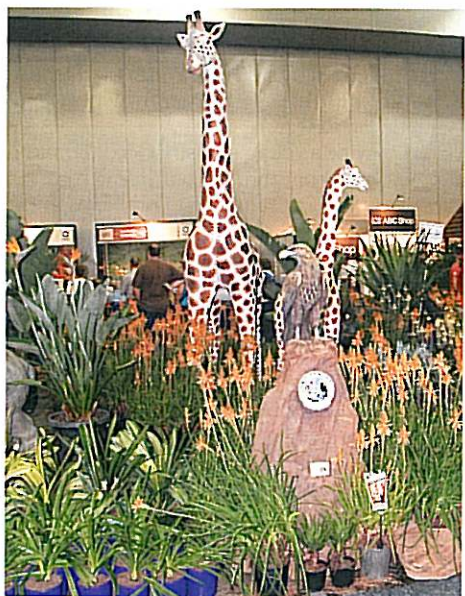


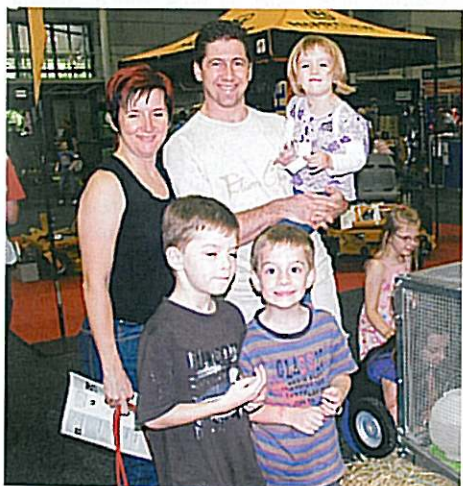
# Gardening Australia Expo

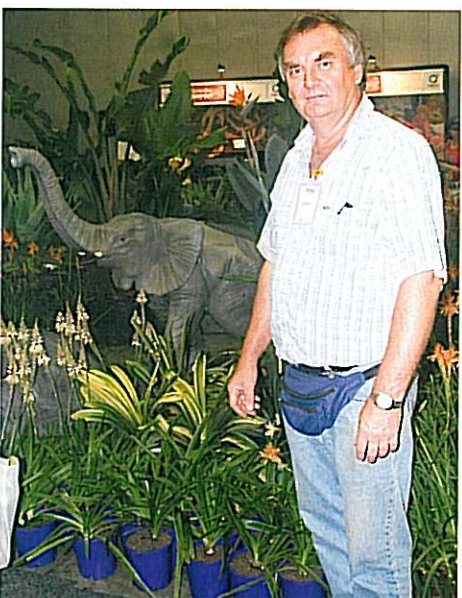

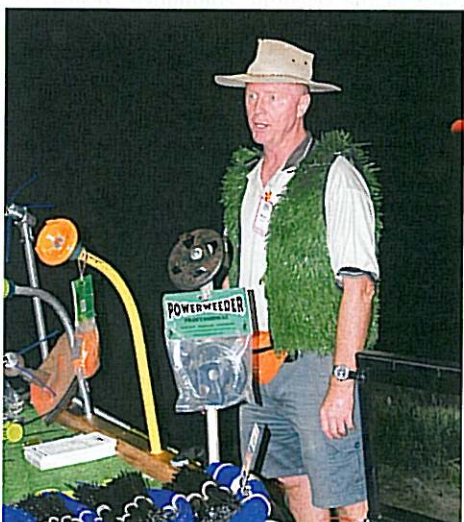
