Anthurium 'Sangria'

Known commonly as the flamingo flower, Anthuriums are among the most spectacular and flamboyant of all indoor plants. This variety is typically quite slow growing and produces slender stems that are topped with flowers that feature brightly coloured spathes. It blooms through spring and into autumn and flowers remain in good condition on the plant for several months. Anthuriums are ideal for pots and tubs.
